The Panther of the Year Award is the highest award presented to a senior at Oak Grove High School. Faculty members select the recipient based on scholarship, character, leadership, service, and activity participation. The Panther of the Year this year participated in volleyball and golf four years – captain of the VB team this year. She also participated in band four years, sophomore and junior years as frontline section leader and senior year as drumline captain. She excelled in choir as a member of the concert choir two years and the swing choir/Impact three years. She earned four gold ratings in state solos and three golds in state small ensembles, participated in the West Central All District Choir, and earned a spot this year in the All State Choir. She received the Outstanding Vocalist Award this year. She served in the Women of Character program all four years and the leadership team three years, National Honor Society two years, and Student Council three years, sophomore and junior years as class president and this year as Student Body President. In theatre productions, she played Little Red Ridinghood in *Into the Woods*, Ugly Duckling and Young Fiona in *Shrek the Musical*, and Edna in *And Then There Were None* and earned

recognition in International Thespian Society and Cappies two years. Throughout HS, she completed all requirements of the A+ Program, earned honor as citizen of the quarter and citizen of the year, and received a Ronald Reagan Presidential Foundation award and the United State Marine Corps Music Excellence Award this year. Among these activities and honors, she earned a 4.107 GPA (5 honors courses), three advanced and two proficient scores on her End of Course exams, and a composite 26 on the ACT. She will attend the University of Wisconsin-Madison in the fall to study Journalism in Communication and Media.
